48, New Street, Quarry Bank, may not be as well-known as 'The Old Cross Guns' in the lore and legend which surrounds our Black Country's most famous canine breed The Staffordshire Bull Terrier - but it is at that address where 'Gentleman Jim' - the most famous of them all was bred by Jack Dunn...

Legend has it that Joe Mallen who kept 'The Old Cross Guns' at Five Ways, Cradley Heath bought the pup off Jack for a mere quid. They both worked at William Griffins worked at William Griffins chainworks and were founder members of The Staffordshire Bull Terrier Club which came into being, under the secretaryship of Joe Dunn (no relation to Jack) in 1935 at Cradley

Best Exhibit at Crufts

In the following year, Joe Mallen took his dog 'Cross Guns Johnson' to Crufts to win Best Exhibit in the breed but it was not until 1939 that The Staffordshire Bull Terrier The Staffordshire Bull Terrier was granted Challenge Certificates. By that time, Joe Mallen was the proud owner of 'Gentleman Jim' - and Joe's famous dog emerged the fully-accredited breed's first Supreme Champion. Joe's original investment in the Quarry Bank pup was repaid many times over, for in addition to providing splendid tion to providing splendid canine companionship to his owner and family 'Gentleman was to command well over a thousand pounds in stud-fees in the ensuing years.

There must have been times There must have been times when Jack Dunn regretted not keeping the pup - but he had other Champions 'up his sleeve'. "Thornhill Pride' (pictured left - with full details of his show accomplishments) was to father many splendid 'Stafford' whelps, himself. His own pedigree was detailed on Jack Dunn's stud-card, as

follows...Parents - Brigands Bos'n (sire) - Clipper of Bodenham (dam) - G/parents - Brindle Bill & Firedancer.... Jolly Rodger & Judy of Bodenham - Gt. Gt. Grandparents - Brindle Mick & Sunny Lady... Tyndal Rip & Vindictive Vixen...Son o' Tim & Lou's Pal...Vindictive Montyson & Pride of Beau....
